Here they are before conversion. The type number is on the base. They shouldn't cost more than a dollar or two each. Try Ebay if your game store dosen't have one.

What makes them out of scale for the Caterpillar P-5000 is that their supposed to be giant machines I'm guessing 100 feet tall.

But if you carefully remove the cockpit cover and ...

carve out the controller. You can then insert a 25-28mm scale head. Here I used HeroClix thugs. They had a cargo worker look to them.

Glue together carefully, make yourself a new base, and you'll have a nice accessory for you cargo hold. Note: watch it superglue on the clear plastic, it will cloud it up.
