Arcarius, if you are referring to the ruins the champion of nurgle is in, those are quite easy to do. Since it's mostly drybrushing. I used 3 of the Ruins of Osgiliath kits from the Lord of the Rings range plus a set of modular movement trays as a base. All are available from Games Workshop. The stairs are from the Uruk-hai siege troops.

When putting together the ruins, I cut the pieces in some places to glue them together again in different ways. Also instead of making them only one-story, I made it a 3-story building.

I didn't use them on the base of the Chaos Warriors but I used them for the bases of the dwarves in those pictures. I have to say that it's way easier to use it than to let the glue for the sand dry plus you don't have to paint it anymore afterwards, just a bit of drybrushing. In order to let it work properly you need a lot of that stuff though (for 10 of those dwarves I used up about a quarter of one pot), so I am not sure what is cheaper. I believe the structured paint to be effectively cheaper. Not sure though.
