Dry brush the second piece with one solid color from Reaper paints that will get the tile to look like Catacombs.
Post the pics of them and tell me what the paint name is you used to drybrush each piece.
Your video makes it look so simple, I might go with some unpainted sets rather than custom painted if I like what I see above. And only you are going to know what single Reaper paint might do that.

Stefan's videos are wonderful! It shows just how easy it is to produce wonderfully painted tiles! You need at least 3 colors (background, midtone and highlight) to produce a 3D 'feel'. Preferably 4 (which is 3 considering the base-coat is already throughout the tile of 'dungeon-gray') as Stefan shows (off-color

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stones).

In my opinion the biggest advantage of getting the tiles painted is uniformity while the biggest advantage of getting them unpainted is the ability to paint themes (ice caverns, Egyptian sandstone, etc.).
